Chair Stephen Schultz called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.

Minutes of February 13, 2007 were approved with minor corrections

New Business:

Carol Deaner distributed copies of a recent article from the Reader and suggested it indicates an opportunity to better publicize the work of the commission. It was suggested it would be helpful for a Reader reporter to attend commission meetings.

Old Business:

Mural at Town Square: Kathleen Hyde reported that Jim Burnett of PSB, a new DSBA board member, would be the contact if it were desired to paint a mural on the “green wall” next year. Carol Deaner will contact an SHS art teacher for an estimate of the cost of material for possible Art by the Inch funding of the mural.

Sidewalk Painting: Carol Deaner reported that a few businesses she contacted about sponsoring sidewalk painting in front of their stores were concerned about the appearance after a period of wear. The commission decided it would be best to start the effort at Farmin Park and/or adjacent to the city parking lot and build support for expansion elsewhere in downtown in future years. Kami Blood distributed results of her research on paint durability, skid resistance and availability. It was decided it was most practical to use latex paint, and that silica sand should be used for skid resistance. A clear sealer overcoat should be done within two weeks. Consensus was to engage ten artists at \$100 each plus \$50 each for a materials allowance, to be paid from Art by the Inch. Stephen Drinkard will draft an RFP form. Carol Deaner will contact interested artists and recommend those for RFPs. Krister Allen will arrange pressure washing of sidewalk areas he and Karen Bowers will propose to Kami Blood, who will verify location with Kody VanDyk and Kim Woodruff. The goal is to have the painting by all artists start June 9, weather permitting, and be completed in any case by the opening of Artwalk 1 on June 22. Publicity will be discussed at a future meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
